This fifth annual "Pinot Passion" Awards showcase the very special people and their very special wines that I believe give us so much to enjoy, and ultimately what makes Pinot Noir so different than other wines.

As in the past, I've tried to recognize that passion in several different ways. I offer my "**Top 12 Pinot Noirs**" and my "**Top 12 Pinot Values**" of 2006 to recognize the obvious passion of the winegrowers and winemakers that manifests itself in these incredible wines. Wines chosen come from the wines I have tasted in the year or so since the last awards issue. I've also included several "Honorable Mention" wines in each category. And my "Pinot's Rising Stars of 2006" recognizes four vintners who are moving up very quickly and are definitely ones to watch.

Medium-deep ruby color; deep black cherry, spice and cinnamon notes; rich and deep, beautiful black cherry flavors, spice and cinnamon notes, silky texture, sweet oak; good structure and balance; long finish.

Terrific juicy fruit and complex spicy notes really make this a joy to drink The 2003 Sonoma Coast blend was my choice for the #2 wine in last year's Pinot Passion Awards. Michael Browne and Dan Kosta have consistently created an amazing blended Pinot at a bargain price. *Originally published in issue #40*.

Medium-deep ruby color; deep, cherry, plum aromas with dusty, spicy notes; deep, complex and rich; stewed red cherry with earthy, dusty notes; sweet oak; good structure and balance; long finish.

Complex and deep, this is a very focused Pinot with the structure to age a bit. Please let this Pinot open up for an hour or so. From the always excellent Savoy Vineyard in Anderson Valley, Winemaker Eric Sussman adds his own signature that makes this a terrific Pinot. *Originally published in issue #40*.



This is the second vintage that winemaker Ben Papapietro has blended Pommard Clone lots from two of his primary vineyards—Leras Family and Peters vineyards. An amazingly deep and complex Pinot that cries out for a deep, earthy meat dish; it also has the silkiness and bright fruit to be a delight to drink all by itself. *Originally published in issue #40*.

Buena Vista Carneros Pinot Noir Carneros 2004

Medium ruby color; deep, earthy cherry and asian spice aromas; rich and ripe with complex dusty cherry flavors, earthy, silky texture, good structure and balance; long finish.

Rich, ripe and spicy Pinot with a beautiful core of cherry fruit. Winemaker Jeff Stewart and the team at Buena Vista (and Beam Wine Estates) have engineered an amazing turnaround at this venerable Carneros winery. Quality, beginning with the 2004 vintage has just jumped exponentially and these Pinots have never been better. *Originally published in issue #41*.

Medium ruby color; spicy, red cherry aromas; deep, complex, interesting red cherry flavors, spicy, cinnamon notes; silky texture; good structure and balance; long finish.

Silky and complex, this is a really interesting Pinot with lots of nuance; serve it with a subtle mushroom pasta or roasted meat dish. The Forrest Estate was established in 1990 by the Forrest family. They've grown their vineyard holdings with additional plantings in Marlborough and a new planting in Central Otago. *Originally published in issue #42.*



PINOT'S MASTER VINTNERS OF 2006

Ben Papapietro Papapietro Perry Winery

For Ben Papapietro, wine was always there—on the dinner table, at all family gatherings and in his grandparents' cellar.

In 1980, Ben started his own garage winery at his San Francisco home. Later, he began helping in the fledgling winery of a fellow newspaper employee-Burt Williams, cofounder of Williams & Selyem. It wasn't long before Ben produced his first solo Pinot Noir, securing enough grapes to produce five gallons of wine. A few years later friend Bruce Perry joined Ben in his winemaking ventures. By 1990, Ben and Bruce found consistent vineyard sources for their homemade Pinot Noir and worked to perfect their craft. Ben and Bruce went commercial with their wine in 1998, producing 75 cases of Pinot Noir. Ben's Pinots are definitely vineyarddriven and thus the styles can vary with each vineyard and vintage, but there's always a core of deep fruit, silky texture, great structure and balance. Pinot bottlings include appellation blends for Russian River and Sonoma Coast, vineyard designates from Peters, Leras Family, Mukaida and Ellsbree vinevards, as well as a Pommard Clones bottling. But beyond the great wines, Ben is a genuinely nice guy; the kind of guy who really makes this business fun.

Harry Peterson-Nedry

Chehalem Wines

Harry Peterson-Nedry, founder, winemaker and managing

partner of Chehalem, came to the wine business like many—a career change inspired by at first a casual love of wine.

His education in chemistry and english from the University of North Carolina led him first to high-tech manufacturing. Harry's passion for Pinot then led him to the Willamette Valley in 1980 where he planted the 37-acre Ridgecrest Vineyard in what would become the Ribbon Ridge AVA. In 1990, he founded Chehalem winery to take that passion to another level. Harry expanded the winery's estate vineyards through partnerships in Corral Creek Vineyard and Stoller Vineyard. He is involved in Oregon wine beyond the winery: he serves on the Oregon Wine Board, and has worked to establish Oregon Pinot Camp, ORCA (the Oregon Chardonnay Alliance), and has worked on the authoring recent Willamette Valley sub-AVA proposals.

Harry's Chehalem Pinots are deep and extracted with moderate amounts of new oak. Pinot bottlings Pinot bottlings include vineyard-designated bottlings from Stoller Vineyard, Ridgecrest Vineyard and Corral Creek as well as a 3 Vineyard blend and a Reserve bottling. These are delicious, stylish Pinots, worth a search of the market.

3. Kris Curran

Sea Smoke Cellars

Kris Curran grew up in the Santa Ynez Valley with a love of animals. She took that love and went on to earn a degree in animal science at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo.

She became fascinated with the wine industry and after earning a degree in winemaking at Fresno State University Kris began the career path that would lead her to her current position as winemaker at Sea Smoke Cellars: first she was assistant winemaker at Cambria Winery in Santa Maria, then winemaker and general manager at Los Olivos startup Koehler Winery. Finally in 2000, Sea Smoke owner Bob Davids hired Kris to set up his new winery in the Santa Rita Hills and head up the winemaking team. Today, Kris employs 10 Pinot Noir clones in the south-facing vineyard blocks to produce each of the winery's three distinctive Pinot bottlings: "Botella," the "lightest" of the three, but still a full, balanced Pinot; "Southing," bigger with more new and toasty oak; and "Ten," featuring the best selections from each of the 10 clones planted in the vineyard.

Kris also makes wine under her own label—Curran—where she focuses on Syrah, Sangiovese and a delicious Grenache Blanc sourced from vineyard sites in the Santa Ynez Valley.

James MacPhail founded MacPhail Family Wines in 2002 with a passion to make great Pinot Noir. His family had been active in Marin and Sonoma counties for generations in the appliance sales, building supply and natural gas businesses and James grew up working in the family business. He became an accomplished classical pianist and bagpiper, as well as a competitive swimmer; he was the youngest person to successfully swim the Golden Gate when he did so in 1983. He attended the University of Nevada, Las Vegas where he earned dual bachelor's degrees in business and hotel administration. Instead of hotels, he began searching out vineyards and released his first Pinots from the 2002 vintage. He continues that search and today produces Pinot from a half a dozen vineyards. His are small production, high texture Pinots that are hard to find and very definitely worth the search.

2.

Erich Bradley

Sojourn Cellars

Erich Bradley met Craig Haserot, his partner in Sojourn Cellars, on the tennis courts of the town of Sonoma. Both had a passion for tennis and, they found, for great wines as well. Erich is the full-time winemaker at Audelssa Estate Winery high in the mountains to the east of Glen Ellen where he makes high-end Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah and Bordeauxstyled blends. With Sojourn he makes Pinot Noir—and really good Pinot at that. The focus is fruit from the Petaluma Gap influenced part of the Sonoma Coast AVA, with an emphasis on the terrific Sangiacomo Vineyard. The 2004 and 2005 Pinots are tremendously deep and lush with miles and miles of complexity. The 2006 wines look easily as good. Erich is a sensitive winemaker with a great talent for expressing the character of the vineyard.

3.

Kenneth Juhasz

Auteur Wines, The Donum Estate

Kenneth Juhasz (pronounced "uhaas") talks a lot about dualism in his winemaking—maintaining the dualism between Pinot Noir's masculine and feminine character; the dualism of sourcing grapes from the Sonoma Coast AVA in California as well as the Willamette Valley in Oregon and his dual roles as winemaker for The Donum Estate in Carneros and his own label, Auteur. Kenneth made his way through school in North Carolina working in fine restaurants and a local wine shop. He headed west to the Willamette Valley to pursue his growing passion for Pinot Noir. Today, he's able to pursue that passion working with Donum Estate's terrific Carneros fruit, as well his Auteur project that he works on with his wife and winery partner, Laura. His Pinots are deep, silky, full of complexity and yet also extremely elegant.

4.

Adam Godlee Campbell

Elk Cove Vineyards

Adam Godlee Campbell has been working and learning about the wine business at Elk Cove Vineyards literally since he was three years old. Founded by his parents Pat and Joe Campbell in 1974, Elk Cove proved to be the perfect "full immersion" training ground for Adam, who went on to earn a bachelor's degree at Lewis and Clark College. He became Elk Cove's winemaker in 1995. At Elk Cove, Adam sources Pinot Noir from 120 acres of estate vineyards on three sites in the Northern Willamette Valley: the Windhill Vineyard, La Boheme Vineyard and the Roosevelt Vineyard. The sites are for the most part steep, south-facing hillside vineyards. Adam's Pinots are deep and concentrated with layers and layers of flavor that really blossom with a little cellar time.

Wine Samples

PinotReport accepts wine samples for use in its general "In The Market" new releases tastings as well as its special tasting reports. Please follow these guidelines for submitting wine samples for review.

1. All samples should be fully finished bottles ready for market.

2. Please submit two bottles of each wine.

3. Each wine submitted should include a data sheet with at minimum the suggested retail price, case production and distribution data.

About Our Tastings

Generally, there are two types of tastings that appear in each issue of **PinotReport**. The first are our regular "In The Market" tastings of Pinot Noirs new on the market. The second are our special "Tasting Reports" where we from time to time focus on a particular appellation, producer or style.

How We Taste

We taste wine in small flights with no more than 12 wines in a tasting session and one tasting session in a day. While all scores are finalized before the wines are revealed, wines are usually kept open for a day or more to see how the wines develop. Additional commentary may be added based on this, but scores are not changed.

All tasting unless otherwise noted is done blind by the Editor. Other tasters may participate, but their scores and comments are not part of the official tasting record. The tasting coordinator (who does not taste) arranges and bags all wines, which are then scored and comments recorded before bags are removed. Duplicate wines are inserted in tastings to measure consistency.

Our tastings are done under controlled, consistent conditions. We do not under any circumstances use tasting notes from large tasting events or other sub-optimal tasting venues in our published, scored tasting reports.

Wine Prices and Sourcing

Wine prices vary all around the country and can often vary significantly within the same city. We make every effort to only publish a winery's suggested retail price. This price in some cases will be higher than those you can find in your local markets. The wines we taste either come from the wineries in the form of tasting samples (always finished bottles ready for market) or wines we purchase at retail or at the winery.

Our Wine Ratings

The wines we taste are rated using a 100-point rating system. We fully understand the ongoing debate over the use of the 100-point system and while we respect the right of those who simply despise the system to continue to do so, we believe that the scale has value when used with the accompanying tasting notes as a **relative guide** to wine quality that has the added benefit of **being familiar** and **truly intuitive** for most consumers.
