THE SOJOURN CELLARS SPRING 2011 WINE RELEASE

IS HERE! 2010 brought us continued growth, and our wines sold out faster than ever. The number one source of our recent growth has been customer referrals. So to those of you who continue to take our wine to dinner parties, bring it to tasting groups, or send your friends to our Tasting Salon here in Sonoma—*Thank You Very Much!*

We have fantastic wines to share with you in 2011, including seven 2009 Pinot noirs and four 2008 Cabernet Sauvignons, which we will once again offer in two releases, in the spring and fall. Our production comprises distinctive Pinot noir wines from the Sonoma Coast and Russian River Valley appellations, complemented by small bottlings of Cabernet Sauvignon from extraordinary Napa Valley vineyard sources. Additionally, we continue to produce our popular Home Ranch Cabernet Sauvignon.


The Spring 2011 Release includes three vineyard designate Pinot noirs and one appellation wine.

- 2009 Sangiacomo Vineyard Pinot noir
- 2009 Gap's Crown Vineyard Pinot noir
- 2009 Rodgers Creek Vineyard Pinot noir
- 2009 Sonoma Coast Pinot noir

The 2009 Pinot noir vintage in both the Sonoma Coast and Russian River Valley appellations has already been recognized for its universal high quality. These wines are concentrated, expressive and well-balanced.

Last fall we released our first Cabernet Sauvignon wines from Napa Valley vineyard sources, and we were thrilled by the positive response from both critics and wine enthusiasts. In addition, Robert Parker recently awarded all four of our 2008 Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignons scores over 90 points. The Spring Release features our 2008 Cabernet Sauvignon from the renowned Beckstoffer Vineyard Georges III (93 points, Robert Parker). The wine is big, rich and forward, and will reward both the early cork pull and years

of cellaring. The remaining 2008 Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignons will be released this fall.

The final wine we are releasing this Spring is the 2008 Home Ranch Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon. This vineyard, located on Craig and Ellen Haserot's property in Sonoma, is now fully mature, and the wine really shows it. The 2008

vintage represents the darkest, most concentrated and flavorful wine produced from this vineyard yet!

We thought we'd have some fun in 2011 by initiating a contest to encourage our customers to stay in touch with us by showing and telling us "where they sojourn with Sojourn". We hope you'll join in by sending us photos (with stories) of you enjoying your Sojourn wine in fun situations. 2009 Sangiacomo Vineyard Pinot Noir, Sonoma Coast

Like previous vintages, the 2009 Sangiacomo Vineyard Pinot noir has a rich, dark fruit profile and a luscious, creamy texture. However, the 2009 vintage is enhanced with additional layers of complex earth and forest floor reflecting our blending of Pinot noir clones Swan and Pommard with our traditional blocks of clones 115 and 777. We are thrilled with how well these additional blocks integrate into our flagship Pinot noir from the Sangiacomo Vineyard.


Situated on Roberts Road at the western base of Sonoma Mountain, climate is key to this vineyard's ability to produce outstanding Pinot noir. Cool ocean breezes and Petaluma Gap fog keep the heat in check. For the 2009 vintage, the weather remained cool and moderate, allowing for a long, even growing season, resulting in mature flavors with ideal natural acidity. Once again the Sangiacomo Vineyard Pinot noir stands out.



2009 Gap's Crown Vineyard Pinot Noir, Sonoma Coast

The highly coveted Gap's Crown Vineyard lies in the foothills of the northern Petaluma Gap. For the 2009 vintage we blended Pinot noir clones 115 and 828, while also incorporating some whole-cluster fermentation. The result is a bold, concentrated wine with a velvety hue, dark fruit aromas, and hints of baking spice. In the mouth, supple tannins lead to a long, lingering finish.


Situated off Roberts Road just above the Sangiacomo Vineyard, Gap's Crown is a high-end hillside vineyard that continues to garner acclaim. In 2009 our fruit came from two distinct blocks, one planted to clone 115 and the other to clone 828. Both have pure western exposure and benefit from the cool micro-climate of this site as well as the natural vine stress created by the severity of the terrain. We believe that the 2009 Gap's Crown Vineyard Pinot noir constitutes a terrific follow up to the well-received 2007 and 2008 vintages!



2009 Rodgers Creek Vineyard Pinot Noir, Sonoma Coast

2009 was our second vintage working with Rodgers Creek Vineyard. Especially well-suited for Pinot noir, this site sits high on a ridge in the heart of the Petaluma Gap, taking the full brunt of wind and thick fog that define this cool climate zone. The vines grow in light, chalky soils on steep inclines, causing natural vine stress and resulting in high levels of concentration.

In 2009 we fermented our block of Pinot noir clone 777 whole-cluster and blended it with two blocks of the Pommard clone. This unique blend forms the foundation of this wine. The whole-cluster fermentation adds verve and depth that compliment the rich spices and dark cherry flavors. This vintage has a pure fruit profile, while still showing nuances of mushroom, earth and Asian spice that dominated the previous vintage.



2009 Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir

In 2009, for the fifth consecutive year, we produced a Sonoma Coast Pinot noir blended wine. Our 2009 vintage includes nine unique blocks, primarily from vineyards at the southern end of the Sonoma Coast appellation. The Rodgers Creek and Keller Estate vineyards contributed the majority of the grapes used to make this blend. Pinot noir clones 115, 777, 667 and Pommard all add unique elements, creating a complex Pinot noir with a myriad of textures and flavors.

This 2009 Pinot noir is the most concentrated and complex Sonoma Coast blend we have bottled to date. Showing aromas of dark cherry, pomegranate and sweet oak, its textures are lush, yet taut, with a subtle edge of acidity. This wine is drinking well now and will continue to evolve over the next several years. At \$39, it represents an incredible value for your wine-buying dollar.



2008 Home Ranch Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon, Sonoma Valley

The 2008 vintage represents the fourth bottling from Craig and Ellen's "Home Ranch" Cabernet Sauvignon vineyard adjacent to their home in Sonoma. In this vintage, the Home Ranch achieved a new level of depth and concentration and represents our best result from this vineyard yet. Expressive with explosive blueberry aromatics leading to hints of chocolate mint, this wine has lush textures framed by fine-grained tannins.

Craig planted the Home Ranch Vineyard in 2002 near the southwestern edge of Sonoma Valley. The vineyard makeup is 80 percent clone 337, 10 percent clone 15, and 10 percent clone 191. Vineyard spacing is 6 ½'x 3 ½' to encourage vine competition for water and nutrients. The Home Ranch Cab has developed quite a following, and we believe fans will be very happy once again with the latest vintage of this celebrated, value-priced wine.



2008 Beckstoffer Vineyard Georges III Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley

In 2008 we were able to secure our first vintage of Cabernet Sauvignon fruit from the world-renowned Beckstoffer Vineyard Georges III, located in Rutherford in the heart of the Napa Valley. This historic vineyard is the former Beaulieu Vineyard No. 3, which was originally planted by Georges de Latour of Beaulieu in 1928. The property is located adjacent to Caymus Winery between Conn Creek Road and Silverado Trail.

We source Cabernet Sauvignon Clone 337 grapes from F Block within Beckstoffer Vineyard Georges III in Rutherford. Soils are primarily sandy loam, with a fair amount of rock from the old creek bed that runs through F block. Defined by its lush, full body and lingering flavors, this wine seems to find every corner of your mouth. Sweet red fruit brightens flavors of cassis, boysenberry and hints of chocolate. We think you will be thrilled with our first effort from this storied vineyard and expect the wine to sell out quickly. (93 points, Robert Parker)


